After a review of disinfectant residual information concerning the Brazosport Water Authority (BWA), the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) has determined that there is no safety issue with BWA's distribution system.

BWA is a community water system in Brazoria County, Texas that treats surface water from Oyster Creek Canal and provides wholesale treated surface water to the City of Freeport, City of Oyster Creek, Dow Chemical Company Plants A and B, City of Lake Jackson, City of Richwood, City of Rosenberg, City of Angleton, City of Brazoria, and City of Clute.

As of September 29, 2020, based on TCEQ data, BWA is in compliance with all state and federal primary and secondary drinking water standards. Any compliance issues of downstream customer, City of Lake Jackson, are separate from the performance of BWA.

BWA is currently a Superior Water System and has recently been recognized through the TCEQ's Public Water System Recognition Program as an Innovative of Proactive System (2014-2017, 2019) and an Outstanding Public Water System (2016).
